June Angel, Joan Cesarini, Peg Gaffney and Joan Morse won 4th Low Net at the Class D JWP Caddy Benefit.

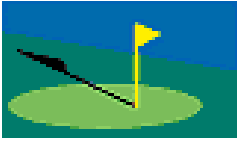

THE BACK NINE

ESCAPE THE ROUGH

Most 100-plus shooters have a hard time placing their drives in the fairway, and struggle to advance their second shots from the rough. To get more distance from the tall grass, trade your 5-iron for a friendlier hybrid version. (These days you can buy hybrid irons all the way down to wedges.) With more mass behind the clubface and a lower center of gravity, a hybrid will get the ball out of the rough more easily than a long iron.



To get the most from a hybrid, set up with the ball in the middle of your stance and your arms dangling from your shoulders. Your hands should hang directly under your chin. Maintain this relaxed feeling as you swing, rotating your body's core through the shot so that at the completion of your swing, your chest points toward the target. The club will do the rest, launching the ball high in the air and farther down the fairway.
